- 1.) Summarize the plot
- 2.) Analyze the main characters
- 3.) Explain the main themes
- 4.) Offer a personal response to the book

Each section should be about  $\frac{1}{2}$  page in length.

DO NOT consult outside sources for this assignment. I want YOUR responses.

## The response should be typed in 12-pt Times New Roman font, double spaced On the first day of class we will submit the assignment to turnitin.com together.

- **7.) Read a book from a "Best of" List**. There are tons of these: New York Times, Goodreads, Rolling Stone, NPR, Publisher's Weekly, etc...
- 8.) Read a book that takes place in another country or continent.
- **9.)** Read a book that is by or about someone from an indigenous culture (Native Americans, Aboriginals, etc). Sherman Alexie and Isabelle Allende are great options.
- 10.) Having a "book snob" moment? Challenge yourself to a National Book Award, Man Booker Prize, Pen Faulkner, or Pulitzer Prize winner from the last decade.
- 11.) Read a book that was published the year you were born.
- 12.) Read a book with more than 500 pages.
- 13.) Read a book with a single word as a title.
- 14.) Read a book with a number in its title.
- 15.) Read a book set in Oklahoma or by an author from Oklahoma
